Dear Colleague,

We are glad to announce that the 2009 Multilingual Interdisciplinary Conferences on Chemical, Mechanical and Materials Engineering (2009 ICCMME) will be hosted in Melbourne, Australia from 07.12.2009 to 20.12.2009. The 2009 ICCMME is a part of the World Conference Series with Virtual Participation[®] that are organised by the Australian Institute of High Energetic Materials.

The main idea behind the organisation of the World Conference Series with Virtual Participation[®] is to create a forum for a global exchange of ideas and results by utilising the benefits of the modern communications technologies. The intention of the organisers of the 2009 ICCMME is to make this event most favourable and non-discriminating to scientists from non-English speaking background. There will be multilingual sessions organised to assist these participants to whom English is not the preferred language. The current list of languages in the Program includes:

- Arabic;
- Chinese;
- Farsi;
- French;
- Korean;
- Portuguese;
- Russian;
- Spanish;
- Turkish.

Organisers of the conference allow inclusions of more languages in this list.

The process of manuscripts selection follows a standard procedure:

- (i) First announcement and call for extended abstracts;
- (ii) Abstract submission and preliminary screening process;
- (iii) Abstract acceptance and call for submission of manuscripts;
- (iv) Manuscript submission and peer-review process;
- (v) Manuscript acceptance and revision process;
- (vi) Final manuscript acceptance after registration. Note that Steps 4 and 5 are valid for these author(s) who require peer review of their manuscripts.

At the end of the selection process each of the accepted manuscripts will participate in Online Direct Discussion Sessions (ODDS), which will be open to all registered participants. These sessions are intended to provide a platform for communications and free exchange of ideas. The aim is to provide productive feedback to the author(s) of the manuscripts and to allow establishing useful personal and business connections between engineers and scientists from all over the world.

Participation in ODDS does not require the physical presence of the author(s) at the conference venue. For this reason, the conferences with virtual participation are:

- **truly affordable**, allowing many scientists and engineers to join the event without spending significant parts of their research funds on visas, expensive airfares and accommodation;

- **time saving** - participation in this type of conferences saves time to many scientists and engineers who are too busy engaged in their research and administrative commitments.

There are no doubts that these precious resources could be better spent!

At the same time, the conferences with virtual participation provide the same benefits to the participants as the conferences that require the physical presence of the attendants.

These benefits include:

- Last, but not least, presenting authors do not have to physically stand and talk in front of a large audience, which could quite often be a stressful experience even for those of the scholars who can fluently speak English.

The organisers sponsor participation in the conference of postgraduate students from all over the world and scientists from selected list of countries by providing discounted registration rates for this category of participants. 30% discount from the regular registration fee of 180 Euro applies to postgraduate students from all over the world and scientists working permanently in one of the following countries:
